

Local Rules

USGA Rules shall govern all play except as modified by the following local rules:

Out of Bounds: Defined by inside points, at ground level of large white stakes or the course side edge of any boundary fence. Rule 18-2. When out of bounds is defined by a public road the point of concrete meeting grass defines the out of bounds.

Holes ,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,17,18.

Drop Zone: Penalty Area on Hole #11: As an additional option, place a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone. Rule 14-3.

Ground Under Repair: Areas defined by closed white lines. French Drains, all seeded and construction areas, stump grinder areas, sod seams, worn out areas near artificially surfaced, (this includes gravel), roads and paths, all beds with planted flowers.

Holes 9,2,5,10,11,12,13,14,16,18.

When a player's ball has not been found or is *known or virtually certain* to be *out of bounds*, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under *stroke and distance*. For **two penalty strokes**, the player may take relief by *dropping* the original ball or another ball in this *relief area* (see Rule 14.3)

Ball in General Area. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b if an *immovable obstruction* is: On the *line of play*, and is: Within two *club-lengths* of the *putting green*, and Within two *club-lengths* of the ball.

A suspension of play for a dangerous situation will be signaled by one long siren. Resumption of play will be signaled by three sirens. See Rule 5.7b.

Pace of Play

Rolling Green Country Club has adopted the USGA Pace Rating System. The **TIME/PAR is a 4 hour or less pace**. All Members and their guests are responsible for honoring this pace at all times.

- The group behind you is irrelevant. Please keep Time/Par pace and keep up with the group in front of you.
- Do not let groups play through. Please just keep pace. Only let groups play through if they have fewer players in their group and there are holes open ahead.

Play Transportation Options

1. Golf Car - Rolling Green has a fleet of 73 EZ-Go golf cars for rent. \$25 Fore-caddies are available. Honor Caddy \$35, A Caddy \$30 per cart
2. Caddies and Push Carts - For those who would like to enjoy additional exercise but cannot carry their bags. Rolling Green has push carts for rent. \$10 Caddies are available. Honor Caddy \$70, A Caddy \$60 and B Caddy \$50. Gratuities are appreciated.

Members are reminded that their guests are their responsibility while enjoying the Club's amenities.

Before You Play

- Tee times may be made in person, by phone, or online, one week in advance.
- Guest play is restricted on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Friday's from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays before 12:00 pm.
- Suitable attire for men and boys includes: Slacks or Bermuda length shorts a maximum of 3 inches above the knee, shirts for men and boys must have a collar and are to be worn tucked in. Mock neck shirts are permitted. Jeans of any kind are not appropriate. Hats must be worn in a forward position. Cargo pants or shorts are not appropriate.
- Suitable attire for women and girls includes golf skirts, skorts, or Bermuda length shorts. Halter tops and jeans of any kind are not appropriate.
- Food and beverage items are available at the course. Outside food and beverages (especially alcohol) is not permitted.

Arrival at the Club

- When Members and guests arrive at the Club please proceed to the portico and drop off your bags at the bag drop.
- After, parking your car please register for play in the Golf Shop.
- The locker rooms are available for you to change your clothes and shoes. Please refrain from changing your shoes anywhere other than the locker room.
- Guest lockers are available upon request.
- The use of cell phones is prohibited in the clubhouse with the exception of the locker rooms. Please keep phones on vibrate.
- Gentlemen are kindly reminded to remove hats upon entering clubhouse areas.
- Rolling Green Country Club prohibits metal or ceramic golf spikes of any kind.

Care of the Course

Bunkers

- Players should always enter and exit bunkers from the low side and never walk up bunker lips. Before leaving a bunker, players should carefully smooth and rake over all holes and footprints made by them and any nearby made by others.
- Please tap or kick of any excess sand on your shoes before walking on the green to putt.

Care of the Course, con't

Repair of Ball Marks, and Damage by Shoes

- Players should carefully repair any divot holes made by them and any damage to the putting green made by the impact of a ball. On completion of the hole by all players in the group, damage to the putting green caused by golf shoes should be repaired.

Divots

- Replace divots whenever possible. If you are unable to replace a divot, use the divot mix provided.
- Additional divot mix is available on all par 3 holes, at the turn, and on holes #5 and #14.

Golf Cars

- Unless otherwise informed, standard cart rules are 90 degrees on all par 4 and par 5 holes. Please keep the car on the path on all par 3 holes.
- Driving golf cars on closely mown approaches to greens and mounds near greens is strictly prohibited.
- Abide by all signage.

Practice Facility

- The dress code applies to all practice areas.
- Please aim all practice shots to the center of the driving range.
